CHATFIELD RESERVOIR PROJECT Email & Letter Writing Campaign



Whether it's a hot bath at the end of a long day or a cool glass of water to quench your thirst, water is essential. Most of us turn on the faucet and expect that water will automatically flow. We seldom question the source of that water and usually take it for granted.

Securing renewable water supplies is a top priority for the Castle Pines North Metropolitan District and many other water providers in our area. If the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approves the Chatfield Reservoir Expansion and Reallocation Project, the people and families we serve will benefit from over 940 acre-feet of renewable water storage capacity, thereby easing our community's dependence on the Denver Basin Aquifer System.

Environmental impacts have been identified and a plan to fully mitigate those impacts is in place.

We respectfully ask that each resident please help us persuade the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to approve the Chatfield Reservoir Expansion and Reallocation Project by emailing or mailing a statement of support to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. We also urge each homeowner association we serve to adopt and submit a formal resolution supporting the project.

President Steve Labossiere's Statement to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Supporting Chatfield Reservoir Project

Monday, June 25, 2012 • Wildlife Experience, Parker, CO

On behalf of the Castle Pines North Metropolitan District and the 10,000 people, 3,200 homes and 19 neighborhoods, as well as the many business and commercial interests we represent and serve, thank you for hosting this public hearing.

If the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers approves the Chatfield Expansion & Reallocation Project, the people and families we serve will benefit from over 940 acre-feet of renewable water storage capacity, thereby easing our community's dependence on the Denver Basin Aquifer System.

Securing renewable water supplies is a top priority for our district and for other water providers in the area. Our Metropolitan District leaders have long had a sense of urgency about renewable water. In a recent survey, by an overwhelming margin, the people of Castle Pines revealed that "securing reliable, long-term renewable water" is the single most vital challenge our community faces.

Our Metropolitan District recently formed a partnership with our neighbors at the Centennial Water and Sanitation District to build a multi-million dollar InterConnect Pump House and Pipeline Project. When completed next year, this project will deliver much of our community's renewable water from Chatfield Reservoir, through Centennial's system, to the people of Castle Pines. Our relationship with Centennial is one of several regional partnerships that we foresee will benefit from securing additional water storage in Chatfield Reservoir.

We take seriously our responsibility to educate our community about the value of water conservation and implementing responsible WaterWise policies. Some of the actions we take include: promoting WaterWise irrigation practices, offering rebates for replacing old appliances and

irrigation equipment, and hosting xeriscape and WaterWise workshops. We value and understand the role conservation plays in helping to stretch vital resources.

We believe the need for this project is clear. According to State Demographer Elizabeth Garner, Douglas County's population will increase from 287,000 people, as it was in the 2010 census, to over 400,000 people in the year 2025. Given that in the year 2000, only 180,000 people lived in Douglas County, the trend is obvious. Our community supports expanding this regional storage facility. The bottom line is that many water providers in the region, the Castle Pines North Metropolitan District included, need a place to store existing and future renewable water supplies. We believe that

expanding the existing Chatfield Reservoir provides a responsible opportunity to store renewable water for the ratepayers we serve and represent. Thank you.
