Location: Metropolitan District's New Pump Station
Directions: From Castle Pines Parkway, travel north on Monarch Blvd. for approximately 3.8 miles. Brightly colored balloons attached to a large sign on the west side of Monarch Blvd., will designate the easy-to-miss turnoff onto a short, primitive access road. (If you pass Rocky Heights Middle School, Rock Canyon High School, and/or McArthur Ranch Road, you've gone too far.)

This \$4.5 million pump station is vital infrastructure through which we will ultimately transport our community's renewable water from Chatfield Reservoir to our distribution system.

We will soon break ground on Phase 2 of the InterConnect Pipeline Project, a 4-mile, 24-inch water pipeline. When completed next year, the people of Castle Pines will finally have access to their renewable water supplies, including: Hock Hocking Mine water, South Platte water, Plum Creek water, and Plum Creek Wastewater Authority discharges.
