## City & Metro District Launch Joint \$3.6 Million Infrastructure-Delivery Project

**Castle Pines, CO** — This week, the City of Castle Pines and Castle Pines North Metro District (CPNMD) launched a joint infrastructure-delivery project to rebuild a half-mile segment of Castle Pines Parkway and replace the existing water main between Yorkshire Drive and Monarch Boulevard.

*“This project marks the first phase in the rebuild of one of our city’s oldest and most traveled roadways. Once completed, it will result in a safer, smoother ride for all modalities, including brand new 6’ bicycle lanes in both directions. This nearly \$3.6 million infrastructure investment is only the first step towards meeting the high expectations of our community,”* said **Castle Pines Mayor Tera Radloff**.

*“We approached the City last year with the idea of delivering both infrastructure projects, simultaneously, and thereby leveraging, saving, and stretching taxpayer dollars. Our collaborative, multi-jurisdictional approach to replacing essential infrastructure is efficient, fiscally responsible, and will benefit every resident, business owner, worker, and commuter in our community,”* said **CPNMD President David McEntire**.

Other project mobility and safety improvements include removing and replacing aging curbs and gutters to create a safer ride for bicyclists; replacing the existing sidewalk on the north side of the parkway with a new, detached six-foot-wide sidewalk; and constructing new ADA-compliant pedestrian curbs and ramps that deliver improved access for people with disabilities.



## PROJECT SCHEDULE

- Work throughout this section of roadway began June 21, 2021, and should conclude in December.

## TRAVEL IMPACTS

Anyone traveling this corridor can expect throughout the project:

- Construction work Monday through Friday, during the hours of 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- Full eastbound lane closures followed by full westbound lane closures after work on the eastbound side has been completed.
- Castle Pines Parkway will remain open to single-lane traffic in both directions, though alternate routes are advised due to likely delays.
- Potential sidewalk closures on the north side of Castle Pines Parkway for pedestrians.
- Bicycle lane closures.
- Various neighborhood entry closures at different times during the project. We will suggest alternate routes as necessary.
  - Current entry closures include:
    - Temporary access closure from Castle Pines Parkway to Shoreham Drive. Use Monarch Boulevard as an alternate route.
    - When traveling westbound on Castle Pines Parkway, left turns onto Yorkshire Drive are temporarily prohibited.
